# PASTOR'S PARAGRAPHS

#### Grace and peace to you!

"13 Someone in the crowd said to him, "Teacher, tell my brother to divide the family inheritance with me." 14 But he said to him, "Friend, who set me to be a judge or arbitrator over you?" 15 And he said to them, "Take care! Be on your guard against all kinds of greed, for one's life does not consist in the abundance of possessions." 16 Then he told them a parable: "The land of a rich man produced abundantly. 17 And he thought to himself, 'What should I do, for I have no place to store my crops?' 18 Then he said, 'I will do this: I will pull down my barns and build larger ones, and there I will store all my grain and my goods. 19 And I will say to my soul, Soul, you have ample goods laid up for many years; relax, eat, drink, be merry.' 20 But God said to him, 'You fool! This very night your life is being demanded of you. And the things you have prepared, whose will they be?' 21 So it is with those who store up treasures for themselves but are not rich toward God.""—Luke 12:13-21

This is the gospel reading for this coming Sunday (August 3<sup>rd</sup>), and this text is used for stewardship pleas. Jesus is in the middle of encouraging his disciples to confess even when they are under threats, violence, and constraints. He is interrupted by someone in the crowd who wants Jesus to settle a financial dispute between siblings. But, Jesus doesn't enter the squabble but instead offers to teach about the seduction of wealth. In this parable that Jesus tells, we probably wonder what the farmer is doing wrong because he is not portrayed as wicked or greedy. And, honestly, what is wrong with building a larger barn to store today's bounty for a leaner tomorrow? I would answer that there is nothing wrong, but there might be an exception. The farmer's focus seems to be on himself: "What should I do, for I have no place to store my crops?" Then he said, "I will do this: I will pull down my barns and build larger ones, and there I will store all my grain and my goods. And I will say to my soul...." There doesn't seem to be

anyone else in the life of the farmer. Maybe this parable isn't about money or wealth. Perhaps this parable is about community. Who was Jesus addressing? The person who brought the complaint? The brother? The disciples? The crowd? Us? How do you hear Jesus' words today? Right now, there is a break in the community! We struggle with our leaders. We struggle with telling the truth and listening to the truth. There seems to be a constant fear. We hear throughout scripture "do not be afraid," and hearing that makes it easier for us to turn to one another with our fears, hopes, dreams, and needs to form a community, because it's hard to care for your neighbor and create community when you are afraid. Community is not easy! It means that we have to tolerate people who may disagree with us. It means that we have to put up with people who might annoy us and even hurt us! Forgiveness and trust are key! The farmer who was rich in possessions but was dirt poor in relationships never got that message. When I was in seminary, Dr. Rick Carlson, who taught my evangelism class, discussed how the church has an inward focus. And, I agree with Dr. Carlson, we focus too much on the inside of these four walls. We, as the church, need an outward focus. We need to focus on what is going on outside these four walls. We need to focus on our communities. How many of us are willing to look outside of these four walls? How many of us are willing to form new relationships in our communities? How many of us are willing to show our community the love of Christ?
