ADVENT WAITING AND WATCHING

Advent is a time of expectant watching and hopeful waiting, a time of eager anticipation and prepared readiness. Jeremiah announces that "the days are surely coming." And Jesus warns that "there will be signs." As the church, we ready ourselves for Christmas, remembering the birth of Jesus, all the while anticipating the fulfillment of Jeremiah's prophecy, "at that time (God) will cause a righteous Branch to spring up, and he shall execute justice and righteousness in the land." And as we remember the birth of Jesus, we also stand guard and watch for "the Son of Man coming in a cloud with power and great glory.

Advent hope is grounded on the promise of God, anticipated through our worship and reflected upon our attentiveness to God's word. We know how, when, and for whom to watch because we have heard God's promise and we remember and attest to the faithfulness of those who witnessed the birth of Jesus and followed in his way. We wait with the assuredness that God shall deliver upon that which God has promised: "the days are surely coming." We also watch with a particular viewpoint beyond the fears and forebodings written upon the ways of the world: "God will cause a righteous Branch to spring up." And we stand guard for the execution of "justice and righteousness in the land."

This Advent season of waiting and watching in December 2020 will be far different than Advents of our past experiences for we continue to have our lives altered in the presence of a viral pandemic. Our thoughts and anticipations are challenged by an everpresent reality of illness and even death; our presumptions of a normal Advent and Christmas are circumvented by social

and communal alterations. But this Advent season may be the most crucial and important time in our lives as we call upon God to awaken us to God's presence and promises, that our prayers in a time of waiting and watchfulness are directed to a hope that realizes and recognizes God's incarnational presence and activity in a world hurting and sorely in need. Now more than ever do we need God's guidance and direction that may lead us beyond this present crisis. Our Advent participation suggests that we are ready and willing to submit ourselves to God's promise and to live our lives under the cosmic and universal Lordship of Jesus Christ. Our Advent participation shall reveal our trust that God's promise is manifested and shall be fulfilled in the coming presence of Jesus Christ. And our Advent participation asserts that we shall not be "weighed down with dissipation and the intoxicating worries of this life," but we shall be alert to God's reign as it draws near.

But again, our Advent participation this year will take on a different look and shape. At least for the first two Sundays of Advent, we will not gather together as a worshipping community in our sanctuaries because of the significant rise of positive COVID-19 cases in our community (though you will be able to view these Advent worship celebrations virtually via our websites and Facebook pages). That is a cause for sadness but not of despair for we know that God will be with us; God's presence will help us so that we are not "weighed down with dissipation and the intoxicating worries of this life." Our familial and social practices of Advent will also likely be altered. Nevertheless, may we continue to bear the promise of the

Reverse Advent Calendar Support this MACY activity!

Remember the days you ate a piece of chocolate every day in December until Christmas from a calendar? **You can still eat that chocolate daily** but we are asking you to place an item each day in a cardboard box that can be used by families in need in our area. All collections are given to the United Way and last year they thanked us over and over again!

Much needed items include: canned fruit and vegetables, canned soups and stews (that are as rounded as a meal as possible), canned beans (especially black), chicken and beef broth, spaghetti sauce, salsa, canned tuna, other canned meats (chicken, etc.)

If possible, try to avoid: juices (too much sugar), candy and desserts, rice/pasta (these are cheap and clients can use their money for these), anything perishable (no refrigeration or freezer available)

Toiletries needed: toilet paper, paper towels, laundry detergent (BIG need), fabric softener, toothpaste (no brushes), body wash, shampoo, hand soap, deodorant, lotions, pony tail holders, combs and brushes, and feminine products
