From Our Pastor...

ADVENT WAITING AND WATCHING

Advent is a time of expectant watching and hopeful waiting, a time of eager anticipation and prepared readiness. Jeremiah announces that “the days are surely coming.” And Jesus warns that “there will be signs.” As the church, we ready ourselves for Christmas, remembering the birth of Jesus, all the while anticipating the fulfillment of Jeremiah’s prophecy, “at that time (God) will cause a righteous Branch to spring up, and he shall execute justice and righteousness in the land.” And as we remember the birth of Jesus, we also stand guard and watch for “the Son of Man coming in a cloud with power and great glory.”

Advent hope is grounded on the promise of God, anticipated through our worship and reflected upon our attentiveness to God’s word. We know how, when, and for whom to watch because we have heard God’s promise and we remember and attest to the faithfulness of those who witnessed the birth of Jesus and followed in his way. We wait with the assuredness that God shall deliver upon that which God has promised: “the days are surely coming.” We also watch with a particular viewpoint beyond the fears and forebodings written upon the ways of the world: “God will cause a righteous Branch to

spring up.” And we stand guard for the execution of “justice and righteousness in the land.”

Our Advent participation suggests that we are ready and willing to submit ourselves to God’s promise and to live our lives under the cosmic and universal Lordship of Jesus Christ. Our Advent participation shall reveal our trust that God’s promise is manifested and shall be fulfilled in the coming presence of Jesus Christ. And our Advent participation asserts that we shall not be “weighed down with dissipation and the intoxicating worries of this life,” but we shall be alert to God’s reign as it draws near.

Advent asks of us: shall our values and dreams be shaped by the promise of God incarnate in Jesus Christ or by commercial schemes and advertising slogans? Are we looking for a good deal at a bargain price or are we allowing ourselves to be embraced with the promise of life in God’s hands? Do we hope for and expect a future that is merely the summation of even the best of our efforts or should and shall we anticipate and prepare for a time to come that bears the marks of the crucified and risen One who promises to return in the embodiment of grace and mercy for his gathered people that we may experience true peace and joy?

“The days are surely coming!” How shall we “read” the signs? How shall we discern the times? Will we be able to “see” the arriving presence of Jesus bringing to fulfillment God’s promise or will he simply be remembered from a story beautifully told some two thousand years in the past?

Shall we be adventurous bearers of expectant hope in the promise of God as fulfilled in the arriving presence of Jesus Christ or shall we cling to past memories and a benign continuation of what already has been?

How shall God find us this Advent: alert and ready for who and what is to come or sluggish and weary from where we have been? With eager anticipation and unbridled hope, what shall we seek: a festive rehearsal of Christmas as an act of mere remembrance or a joyous song led by a choir of angels that announces the arriving presence of Jesus who changes the present by revealing the gift of salvation and the eternal execution of justice and righteousness for all?

Hope and pray! Wait and watch! Be ready! Advent is here and Jesus is on his way!

November 1, 2017

Meeting called to order at 1901 by Pr. John.

Present: Cher Girton, Gary Girton, Pr. John Yost, Harry Boyer, Jeff Mensch, Deanna Billow, Barb Randecker, Jane Moore and guests Doug & Morgan Richard

Absent: Liz Loss, Tanna Stenger, Jim Schwartz, and Logan Mensch

Pr. John opened with devotions, reviewing the book of Revelations and All Saints Day.

Guests report: written report submitted; their proposal to utilize parsonage for their counselling services

Secretary's Report: October minutes were submitted and approved as read.

Treasurer's Report: October reports submitted and approved as read subject to audit.

Pastor's report: Pr. John thanked everyone for their participation in the Reformation service. Not a good turnout for the German hymn sing due to weather. Heading into busy season. He believes we need to look at who we are as a congregation and where we're going in many different ways.

Communication: Harry Boyer reported that he received a letter from Sally Rothermel resigning from Staff Support effective December 31, 2017. Jeff Mensch motioned to accept the resignation, seconded by Barb Randecker; motion passed unanimously. Also received written request from Matt Wagner, VP Christkindl, for use of the church and parsonage during Christkindl.

Executive: None

Gifts & Endowments – None

Worship & Music – Bill Musser had no report.

Property – Air conditioning is complete and thermostats are programmed. Ceiling tiles in the hall are being replaced and work is almost complete.

Christian Education – no report

Fellowship & Recreation – Jeff Mensch reminded that the holiday dinner would be held in conjunction with the annual meeting in January.

Service & Outreach – no report

Finance – Jeff Mensch reported that Sholley Agency is working on a new quote for liability insurance. Pr. John revisited the audit discussion. No further action has been taken.

Youth – Kim Sawyer submitted a written report on October's activities.

Staff Support – no report

Parish Council: Jeff Mensch reported they met in October. Parish contribution will not change for 2018; Pr. John's salary will remain the same but will increase his retirement contribution. New Year's Eve service will be combined at 10:00AM at First Lutheran. Lent will begin on Valentine's Day this year and end on April 1st.

Business:

Acolytes: Trena Zeller requested updated acolyte list; volunteers are dwindling. Schedule 2 Sundays per month and let the other two open. Chief Usher will get volunteers for the two open Sundays.

Snow Removal: Received proposal from Schlegal Excavating for snow removal. Same prices as last year. Jeff Mensch made motion to accept contract, seconded by Jane Moore; motion passed unanimously.

Parsonage; Heating & Electric: Discussion was had as to Doug & Morgan Richard's request to use the parsonage for their counselling services. Significant increased heating costs will be incurred and are not built into the 2018 budget. Discussion was had as to how to proceed financially. Jeff Mensch made motion that we enter into an Informal Agreement with them; terms to include: 1. They fund proposed repairs, 2. They make a \$3000 donation to the church in 2018 and 3. They make a \$3500 donation in 2019. Gary Girton seconded the motion; passed unanimously. Harry Boyer will discuss the proposal with them.

Security System: Extremely difficult to work with. Have alarms go off and Select calls and they won't recognize our "pin" or "password". Contact people should be Pr. John, Jim Schwartz, Cher Girton & Heather Klose. We would like to discontinue the security portion and maintain the fire protection. Jeff Mensch made motion to contact Select and determine if this is possible; if so proceed as above, seconded by Gary Girton; motion passed unanimously.

Christkindl: Discussed requests received from Matt Wagner. Jane Moore moved to approve all requests with the exception of Saturday German breakfast, seconded by Gary Girton; motion passed unanimously.

Apple Dumpling Proceeds: Harry Boyer reported that initially the proceeds were to be split as follows: 50% to Youth, 25% to Logan Roush and 25% to Karen Kurtz. Youth now would like to split to youth money with another beneficiary. Youth committee would need to meet and discuss that as it wasn't part of the initial motion. Discussion was also had regarding the 10% tithe from the proceeds that has been historically given to the church. Jeff Mensch made motion to give the church a 10% tithe based on historical actions, seconded by Barb Randecker; motion passed unanimously. Net proceeds after tithe is \$10,548.

Parking Notices: Need to make signs for people who park in the lot on Sundays. Office will take care of that.

December Meeting: Council will meet at Carriage Corner at 6:00PM for the December meeting.

2018 Nominations: Committee has not obtained names as of right now.

Bulletin: Deanna Billow reported she liked the bulletin at Christ's United and the way events are listed chronologically.

Meeting closed with prayer by Harry Boyer and adjourned @ 2120.
