From Our Pastor...

A THANKSGIVING OF DOING THE "WHAT IFS"

We now have entered another liturgical season of Advent., a four week prelude to the Christmas season. Advent, meaning "arrival" or "a coming," is a time of expectation, anticipation and preparation as we await the fullness of God's promised eternal will as revealed in and through the arriving presence of Jesus Christ, our Lord and Savior. In some ways though, our cultural habits and our theological convictions may conflict with the theme and purpose of Advent as a liturgical time of the church.

Commercially, as evidenced by the retail and media markets, the focus is entirely on Christmas; that is the Christmas of decorations, presents and parties, Santa and the elves. The focus is less on the remembrance of Jesus' birth as it is on feeling good about ourselves and what we have. Despite the at-times overbearing commercialism of Christmas in our time and place, the airplay of Christmas carols and the placement of nativity sets do allow for an image of the incarnation of Christ to be seen and heard. What is missing though, covered over by such commercial excess, is a proper focus on the meaning and the purpose of Jesus' arriving presence in our lives. Because of its cultural and commercial trappings, our Christmas expectations have moved further away from the

expected Jesus of peace and more towards the expected arrival of more stuff.

But before we lay the hammer down entirely on commercial and cultural exploits, we need also notice the manner in which our theological convictions test our understanding of Advent. Rightly, we do and should attend to a focus of the "first" coming of Jesus and the eternal benefits we have received because of the way He lived, died, and was raised from the dead for each and every one of us. In addition, we believe that the Risen Jesus is with us now- in our hearts, in our gatherings in His name, in our Eucharist celebrations, even in the faces of the least of these- helping and empowering us to transform the world by sharing the gospel and serving one another out of Christian love.

If we can talk about the benefits we have already received in Christ- forgiveness, redemption, salvation- how are we now to envision and understand His "future" coming? What more are we to expect? Do we emphasize our hope in the restoration of all things in heaven and on earth and God's promised peace on earth as much as we place our hope in salvation of the person? How are we and do we understand God's promise to and for us in and through Jesus? What is to be our future as it is connected to the gift of Jesus? That we will get to heaven or that God in Jesus in

and through us has more to bear on what is going on in our present world? Is the "coming" of Jesus merely intended as a transporter to heaven or is He "coming" to effect change in the here-and -now?

As the church we need to attest to the "first" coming of Jesus, his birth in a manger in Bethlehem; for all of our theological foundations are derived from this incarnational event. Jesus came into our world to reveal both the truth of God's promised will and to establish the reality of God's eternal reign. In Christ, we have come to know our proper, eternal relationship with God, received by grace and lived in and by faith. Through and by Jesus' faithfulness, we live trusting in His love and forgiveness, and in the promise of hopedfor peace and salvation. As believers, we are also called to be people of expectant hope for even as the fullness of God has been revealed in Jesus, the fullness of God's will, the transformation of heaven and earth bearing peace and justice for all, awaits completion. Therefore, we are "saved," but for the purpose of living by faith in the expectant hope that Jesus' continuing arrival and His "future" (or second) coming will guide and lead us into the fullness of God's peace.

Advent is a necessary reality check– against the cultural

idolatries that subsume Christmas into a n "accumulation of stuff" motive as well as against those theological certainties that assume that God's work in Jesus is already fully accomplished. Advent helps us to realize in our waiting, in our watchfulness, I our preparations that Jesus' work continues in our world today and into the tomorrows, and that God's promises, although already unveiled in the incarnation of Jesus, await full consummation only as God's desire of peace and justice for all becomes a reality "on earth as it is in heaven." We now live the promise; soon we shall live its full effect. In faith, with the prophets and the apostles, we can imagine what is to be: "For a child has been born for us, a son given to us; authority rests upon his shoulders; and he is named Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace. His authority shall grow continually, and there shall be endless peace for the throne of David and His Kingdom;: (Isaiah 9) and "By the tender mercy of our

God, the dawn from on high shall break upon us, to give light to those who sit in darkness and in the shadow of death, to guide our feet into the way of peace." (Luke1)

May we keep the spirit of Christmas alive as we properly remember and reflect upon the way in which Jesus came and lived among us, bearing forgiveness and love in order that we may live redeemed and saved lives. But as importantly, we may continually keep Advent hope alive as we expect the fullness of God's promised peace to ever unfold through our lives of faithfulness in following Jesus until the day when all shall acknowledge Jesus as Lord and all shall live in His peace.

And in this in-between time, may we honor God as together we worship God regularly, pray constantly, serve one another in the way of Jesus' love, unconditionally and without judgement, and expect with assurance the fullness of God's possibilities arriving continually in the presence of Jesus. AMEN
