## From Our Pastor...

### PRAYER AND PRACTICE

In Ephesians 3-4, Paul writes intimately about the proper perspective and purpose of the church and where the church receives its power to do so. God's plan for the church has been revealed in and through Christ, a destiny of fulfillment and recognized in hope, as we and the church are marked with the seal of the promised Holy Spirit (Ephesians 1:3-14). The working out of God's purpose and destiny for us as the church begins with a calling to use our gifts in the service of ministry that directs and builds up the church to be one body, a unity that expresses through its ministry that there "is one body and one Spirit...one Lord, one faith, one baptism, one God and Father of all" (Ephesians 4:4-6).

The church is a gift from God properly expressed in carrying out the vision of God revealed in the service of Christ and actualized in the

utilization of the gifts given to us. The church activates God's plan and purpose through its unity and mission as it "equips the saints for the work of ministry, for building up the body of Christ, until all of us come to the unity of the faith and of the knowledge of the Son of God, to maturity, to the measure of the full stature of Christ" (Ephesians 4:12-13). The church is the instrument by which God reveals and empowers the mission of Christ to be fulfilled, expressed through the unity of the church as well as through the proper utilization of its gifts to exercise its ministry in Christ's name.

As Paul understands, the task of the church is revealed and maintained as it "promotes the body's growth in building itself up in love" (Ephesians 4:16). Likewise, the church is able to practice its faith and to understand its empowerment through engaging in prayer for strength and direction to carry forth God's

plan and will that all come to "the full stature of Christ." Paul himself prays that God "may grant that (we) be strengthened in (our) inner being with power through his Spirit, and that Christ may dwell in (our) hearts through faith, as (we) are being rooted and grounded in love" (Ephesians 3:16-17).

As we anticipate and discern through the presence of the Holy Spirit the cause and direction of the ministries of our congregations and parish for the upcoming year, we need continue to seek God's vision for us through continuous prayer and we are compelled to actively practice our faith by understanding and implementing the empowerment we have received to carry forth the mission of Christ properly revealed through the unity of the church working together to promote a maturity of faith and the building up of the saints in love, by (being) imitators of God, as beloved

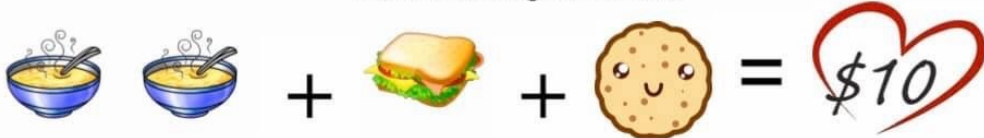
