PRAYER AND PRACTICE

In Ephesians 3-4, Paul writes intimately about the proper perspective and purpose of the church and where the church receives its power to do so. God's plan for the church has been revealed in and through Christ. a destiny of fulfillment recognized and hope, as we and the church are marked with the seal of the promised Holy Spirit (Ephesians 1:3-14). The working out of purpose and God's destiny for us as the church begins with a calling to use our gifts the service ministry that directs and builds up the church to be one body, a unity that expresses through its ministry that there "is one body one Spirit...one and Lord, one faith, one baptism, one God and **Father** all" (Ephesians 4:4-6).

The church is a gift from God properly expressed in carrying out the vision of God revealed in the service of Christ and actualized in the

utilization of the gifts given to us. The church activates God's plan and purpose through its unity and mission as it "equips the saints for the work of ministry, for building up the body of Christ, until all of us come to the unity of the faith and of the knowledge of the Son of God, to maturity, to the measure of the full stature Christ" (Ephesians 4:12-13). The church is the instrument by which God reveals and empowers the mission Christ to fulfilled, expressed through the unity of the church as well as through the proper utilization of its gifts to exercise its ministry in Christ's name.

As Paul understands, the task of the church revealed is and maintained it as "promotes the body's growth building in itself up love" (Ephesians 4:16). Likewise, the church is able to practice its and faith to understand its empowerment through engaging in prayer for strength and direction to carry forth God's

plan and will that all "the full to come of Christ." stature Paul himself prays that God "may grant that (we) be strengthened in (our) inner being with through his power Spirit, and that Christ may dwell in (our) hearts through faith, (we) are being rooted and grounded in love" (Ephesians 3:16-17).
