THE HOLY SPIRIT AND US

On Sunday, May 31st, the church will celebrate the Day of Pentecost. This liturgical festival commemorates the giving of the Holy Spirit to 120 followers of Jesus enabling them to share the gospel in multiple languages in order for the gospel to reach the ends of the world. This event of the giving of the Holy Spirit is sometimes referred to as the "birth" of the church, although the continuance of the ministry begun by Jesus happened immediately following Jesus' death and resurrection, and did not delay until fifty days later. The celebration of Pentecost focuses more on the manner in which now the Spirit empowers and enables the witness of the gospel to reach further than it had been able to before.

The writers of the New testament multifaceted present а understanding of the role of the Holy Spirit. For the writer of Luke/ Acts, the Holy Spirit is the presence of God's power following Jesus' resurrection, given to believers enabling them to bear witness to the gospel and to the faith in word and deed. The Spirit is the power that both gives faith and allows for its movement out into the world. The writer of John often refers to the Spirit as the "paraclete." This word contains multitudes. It literally means one who walks along the side of another, and therefore is representative of one who is comforter, helper, consoler, advocate. Here, the Spirit takes on the role manifestly displayed by Jesus himself in his earthly ministry.

The Apostle Paul understood the Holy Spirit as guide and intercessor on our behalf, and bestowing upon us "spiritual gifts", supporting believers in prayer and action. It is the Holy Spirit that gives us the courage and the fortitude to bear witness to the gospel of Christ Jesus in all circumstances, no matter the difficulty or danger. It is the Holy Spirit that enables us to understand who we really are before God and our Lord Jesus, and helps us in strength and weakness. Paul noted in Romans 8:11- "If the Spirit of him who raised Jesus from the dead dwells in you, he who raised Christ from the dead will give life to your mortal bodies also through his Spirit that dwells in you."

But in times like we are now experiencing with the COVID-19 viral pandemic, and all the issues and uncertainties raised, we can look to the guidance and the intercessions that the Holy Spirit to help us through. All the questions of why and who and how and when are absorbed by the Holy Spirit in order to guide and help us in our discernments, discussions, and decisions. Rather than a focus on self-assertions and personal preferences and opinions that may not be in accord with God's will, the Holy Spirit will step in in times of our uncertainty to direct our needs before God and guide us into thoughts and behaviors reflective of the gospel of Jesus. Paul asserted in Romans 8:26-27- "Likewise, the Spirit helps us in our weakness; for we do not know how to pray as we but ought, that very Spirit intercedes with sighs too deep for
