PASTOR'S PARAGRAPHS

Grace and peace to you!

"I lift up my eyes to the hills—from where will my help come? My help comes from the Lord, who made heaven and earth. He will not let your foot be moved; he who keeps you will not slumber. He who keeps Israel will neither slumber nor sleep. The Lord is your keeper; the Lord is your shade at your right hand. The sun shall not strike you by day, nor the moon by night. The Lord will keep you from all evil; he will keep your life. The Lord will keep your going out and your coming in from this time on and forevermore." —Psalm 121

Psalm 121 has been one of my favorite Bible verses for many years. My great-grandparents were farmers during The Great Depression, and farming was tough and did not pay much. Also, they raised nine children. They faced many hardships during this time, but they never gave up! They could have given up being farmers and chosen a different career path, but they never gave up!

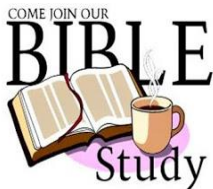
I reflected on this Psalm quite often while in my discernment process and during my seminary time, and it guided me through some tough times. The same God that guided the Israelites through their desert journey and provided for them was the same God that guided and provided for my great-grandparents during the hardships of The Great Depression. Today it is still that same God that is guiding and providing for all of us during the hardships and uncertainties we face in this broken world. May you know that whatever difficulties we face, God is there, ready to care for and love us.

As I write this piece, we are preparing to enter the long liturgical green season of Ordinary Time. This is a time of living, growing, and of course, loving our neighbor. I struggle with the word “ordinary” because these are not ordinary times we live in. It is Jesus who invites us to love and care for all people. It is Jesus that stands up for the lowly. It is Jesus that stands up for those who many of us would deem as outcasts. As the church, I think we have struggled with these issues, and it is hard for us to love and care for all of God’s beloved children. I challenge you as the Body of Christ to find ways to continue to grow and love one another in these “ordinary times.”

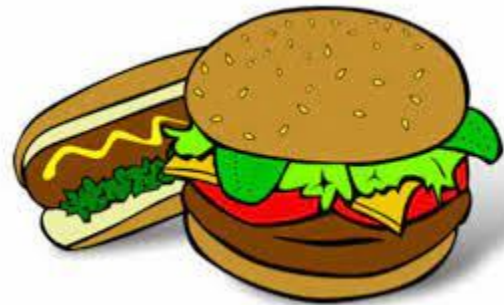

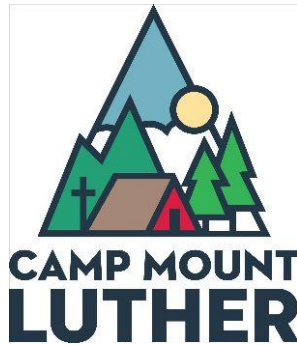
