From Our Pastor...

#### **LENT**

We are ready to begin another season of Lent on Ash Wednesday (March 6th). Lent is a forty day period (excluding Sundays, which are understood as days of resurrection) in which the church intentionally prepares spiritual through the disciplines of worship, study and service to celebrate the new life given through and by the life. death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. In its earliest history, Lent was reserved as a time to instruct recent converts to the Christian faith in preparation for their baptism at the Easter vigil.

As Lent is observed in today's world, the emphasis often placed deepening awareness of one's and piety faith relationship to the forgiveness of sin received upon Christ's actions in life and on the cross, and the new life offered to us in the promise of the resurrection. Such an emphasis always calls the believer to return to the ways of the Lord in thought, word and deed.

Lent has been seen as a time for repentance and spiritual growth; a time to cast off that which is contrary to God's will and a time to put on the example of Jesus' selfless and unconditional love. It is a time for confession and a time of unbridled hope. Lent faces us squarely before the reality of

sin as well as the promise of God's forgiveness. It holds the church accountable at the same time it promotes the possibility of new life that can only come from God.

Lent is a moment of encouragement rather than despair because it boldly declares that the world is under the sovereignty of God. It beacons a call for justice and righteousness even in the midst of the devastating consequences of sin. In Lent, the church cries out that Christ is the victor over sin and its effects. Therefore, it need not fall prey to fear and threats from the agents of evil and the perpetrators of false security.

Lent is not a dark cloud hanging over our fears, doubts and uncertainties. Lent lifts the veil cast by human sin and reveals the truth about God in Christ whose love spares sinners and sustains believers. Lent gives pause to the ways believers may reflect upon their future with God.

Lent is all about LOOKING, EXAMINING,

NEGOTIATING, and TRUSTING. In Christ, we have the power to see things as they really are. In Christ, we have the ability to test our thoughts, words and deeds in light of God's will fully revealed in Jesus. In Christ, we can journey through life's curves in faithfulness to God's promised future. And in Christ, we are given the power to follow the way of life eternal.

LOOK at the world and the way it seems to be working.

LOOK at the cross of Jesus and the word of God.

LOOK for hope in the right place, in God's promises.

EXAMINE the effects of sin and brokenness in the world.

EXAMINE the forgiveness and love of Christ Jesus.

EXAMINE your role both as sinner and as forgiven.

NEGOTIATE through the vastness of options and opportunities.

NEGOTIATE your freedom only as you take up your cross.

NEGOTIATE your choices as you love as Jesus loves.

TRUST God's word of grace, mercy and steadfast care.

TRUST the obedient and selfless love of Jesus.

TRUST the power of the Spirit in you.

This Lent: worship regularly, study with other sisters and brothers in Christ, and participate actively in the ministries of the church.

Mine is a letter expressing deepest thanks for your congregation's generous efforts in last year's "Christmas-at-Sea" project to provide gifts of warm clothing, snacks, and holiday greetings to cargo crew members forced to sit out Christmas in New York harbor far fro their homelands and families. (Most crew members call the Philippines their home). "You should have seen the look on the seafarers' faces when our six port-chaplains distributed the 670 gift sacks from Upper Susquehnna congregations." These were the words of Rev. Marge Drege, executive director of Seafarers' International House whose ministry to ships' crews dates back to 1837 when the service was limited to Swedish ships' crews and immigrants headed west to the American heartland.

The compassionate and generous response by your congregation might encourage those USS churches who were unmoved or uninformed of the project in 2018 to respond in 2019 as generously as you did last fall.

Please share these words of appreciation with your congregation council and the congregation as a whole. Thank you.
