From Our Pastor...

RESURRECTION FAITH

As Christians, we profess that we believe. What do we believe and what is the basis of our belief are the fundamental questions?

We say that we believe in God, and that we believe God; that is, we believe what God says regarding God's own identity and purpose as well as the ways in which God instructs us through commandments and promises. We believe that God is the creator of the heavens and the earth and all that lies therein. But we also believe that God is active and present in our lives today, continuing to unveil before us the reality of God's promises. Particularly as Christians, we believe that God's promises to and for us are revealed to us now through and by God's presence in Jesus Christ. And here lies the crux of the matter: the foundation of our faith is based on understanding how, where and why Jesus is present to and for us now.

It is necessary to assert that our faith, built and sustained upon the living presence of Jesus Christ in our lives, is not fundamentally an ascent to a set of doctrines or religious principles nor a remembrance of certain historic realities, as important as they may be to the articulation of our beliefs. That the Bible records events such as the calling of Abraham to be a blessing to the nations, Israel's release from Pharaoh's captivity, the prophetic counsel of Isaiah, the witness of John the Baptist, and even the recollected reflections of Jesus' disciples who testified about Jesus' miraculous actions and influential words is not the foundational basis of faith for us as Christians.

These Biblical accounts help us gain both perspective and perception on the manner in which God related to God's people in our historic past. Even as these accounts revealed God's promise of what is to be, they were primarily reflections upon what once was. But the premise of our faith as Christians now does not rest upon an assertion that Jesus once was, no matter how great that life was in



terms of teachings, miracles and sacrifice. We believe as Christians because we believe we are in a living relationship with the Risen Jesus now. To be sure, Jesus' life, ministry and teachings as well as his laying down his life for us upon the cross as recorded in the Bible are integral for an understanding of the manner in which God has related to God's people through Jesus; nevertheless, our faith asserts that this same Jesus is alive, alive to and for us in the present. Simply put, we believe because Jesus lives!

We believe not only what Jesus once was and what his disciples told about him; we believe, more so, that we are in a living relationship with God through the presence of the Risen Jesus who continues to guide and direct us in the way of faith. This understanding is supported by the apostle Paul's counsel letter to the Corinthians. particularly where he states, "If Christ has not been raised, then our proclamation has been in vain and your faith has been in vain.... If Christ has not been raised, your faith is futile and you are still in your sins," (1 Cor. 15:14,17).

Easter is the heart and soul of our faith. We live in faith and hope as we proclaim: "Christ is risen!" "He is risen, indeed!" Faith that rests short of this Easter proclamation merely rests upon remembering someone else's faith experiences from the past. And that is reminiscence, not faith. We don't believe because Peter and Andrew once upon a time followed Jesus and witnessed his life experiences. We don't believe because Jesus' disciples saw him hanging upon a cross. We don't believe because Mary saw that the tomb was empty. We don't believe because Paul had an experience with Jesus on the road to Damascus.

WE BELIEVE because we now are in relationship with this same Jesus as these other people were in their historical situations! To be sure, our faith is related to Peter's, Mary's and Paul's faith, though not merely because they had faith, but because our shared faith is in and with the same Jesus who was, who

is, and will continue to be.

This is why evangelism is not simply about putting a Bible in someone else's hands or trying to convince that person to believe in our faith experiences. The Bible as well as our faith experiences may help shape a perspective of Jesus for another but evangelism which witnesses to and promotes Christian faith rests solely upon helping others experience for themselves the saving presence of the Risen Jesus in their own lives. To believe in Jesus is to experience his presence, his love, his peace and his guiding grace in our lives now. Incumbent to our faith is, by grace-imbued ability, to recognize continuously the presence of the Risen Jesus in our lives, and to help others to "see" this same Jesus in their lives as well. Jesus lives that our lives may be filled with God's abundant love and that we may hope, not merely in a future, but within the embrace of God's eternity.

We believe not merely because of someone else's account of witnessing the Risen Jesus. How could we be sure that that person's account is reliable or that the Risen Jesus would necessarily be available to us. We can only come to say that we believe Jesus is risen from the dead and is alive and present now only as we are able to experience his real and lively presence in our own lives. As such, resurrection or Easter faith is not a proposition but a living relationship that exists within the dimensions bounded by our conception and death but not forever contained by these limitations. As the apostle Paul asserts, "Death has been swallowed up in victory," (1 Cor. 15:54).

We live and believe because Jesus lives. Jesus lives to provide both direction and hope for our lives and relationships. Jesus lives to reveal that brokenness, estrangement and death itself are not the final chapters of human existence or of God's intended will. Jesus lives to enable us to "see" his presence even in our own suffering and brokenness so that we may not fall into despair or discouragement. Jesus lives to help each and all of us to experience the fullness of God's eternal love beyond the constraining dimensions of sin and death. The blessing of faith is in the way we are able to "see" Jesus in our own lives and experiences, in others who bring the presence of Jesus to us, and in those whom God brings before us that they may "see" Jesus in us.
