From Our Pastor...

LENT

We are ready to begin another season of Lent on Ash Wednesday (February 10th). Lent is a forty day period (excluding Sundays, which are understood as days of resurrection) in which the church intentionally prepares through the spiritual disciplines of worship, study and service to celebrate the new life given through and by the life, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. In its earliest history, Lent was reserved as a time to instruct recent converts to the Christian faith in preparation for their baptism at the Easter vigil.

As Lent is observed in today's world, the emphasis is often placed on a deepening awareness of one's faith and piety in relationship to the forgiveness of sin received upon Christ's actions in life and on the cross, and the new life offered to us in the promise of the resurrection. Such an emphasis always calls the believer to return to the ways of the Lord in thought, word and deed.

Lent has been seen as a time for repentance and spiritual growth; a time to cast off that which is contrary to God's will and a time to put on the example of Jesus' selfless and unconditional love. It is a time for confession and a time of unbridled hope. Lent faces us squarely be-

fore the reality of sin as well as the promise of God's forgiveness. It holds the church accountable at the same time it promotes the possibility of new life that can only come from God.

Lent is a moment of encouragement rather than despair because it boldly declares that the world is under the sovereignty of God. It beacons a call for justice and righteousness even in the midst of the devastating consequences of sin. In Lent, the church cries out that Christ is the victor over sin and its effects. Therefore, it need not fall prey to fear and threats from the agents of evil and the perpetrators of false security.

Lent is not a dark cloud hanging over our fears, doubts and uncertainties. Lent lifts the veil cast by human sin and reveals the truth about God in Christ whose love spares sinners and sustains believers. Lent gives pause to the ways believers may reflect upon their future with God.

Lent is all about LOOKING, EXAMINING, NEGOTIATING, and TRUSTING. In Christ, we have the power to see things as they really are. In Christ, we have the ability to test our thoughts, words and deeds in light of God's will fully revealed in Jesus. In Christ, we can journey

through life's curves in faithfulness to God's promised future. And in Christ, we are given the power to follow the way of life eternal.

LOOK at the world and the way it seems to be working.

LOOK at the cross of Jesus and the word of God.

LOOK for hope in the right place, in God's promises.

EXAMINE the effects of sin and brokenness in the world.

EXAMINE the forgiveness and love of Christ Jesus.

EXAMINE your role both as sinner and as forgiven.

N E G O T I A T E through the vastness of options and opportunities.

NEGOTIATE your freedom only as you take up your cross.

NEGOTIATE your choices as you love as Jesus loves.

TRUST God's word of grace, mercy and steadfast care.

TRUST the obedient and selfless love of Jesus.

TRUST the power of the Spirit in you.

This Lent: worship regularly, study with other sisters and brothers in Christ, and participate actively in the ministries of the church.

Council Conner-Property Update

- LED Lighting project is complete.
- Security alarm & Lock project is complete except for computer programming in the church office. That will be done after the office purchases a new computer.
- Removed rotted basement window and frame on the west side under the sacristy. Installed new frame and window.
- Plumbers have been notified and will be running a camera through our sewer lines to locate and repair any lines that have collapsed. Latest flooding occurred in early February.
- When the sewer lines are repaired under the social room tile floors, bids will

- be sought for new flooring. The building committee is recommending interlocking floating wood laminate type material.
- Cordless vacuum cleaner was delivered.
- Serviced multi-purpose room heater units – greased bearing/belt dressing on fan belts.
- Building committee is proposing that a line of credit be established to finance the church exterior repair and sealing.
- Sanctuary carpeting is complete and the balcony stair carpeting is being scheduled.

Security System Update/New Locking Procedures....

The new security system installation is now complete. This includes automatic fire alarms, building locking and burglary alarms.

The building now unlocks automatically everyday at 8:00AM and locks every night at 10:00PM.

The security system engages every night at 11:00PM and unarms everyday at 7:00AM.

Please note, if you have a key that unlocks an outside door, that key will no longer work on the outside doors (it still works on the interior doors). If you need access to the building during a designated locked period, please contact a staff member to make arrangements for unlock-

Members who have been issued a key fob: you are only permitted to unlock the building during times when the alarm system is not engaged (one hour prior and one hour after the posted "unlocked" times). Any other times will result in activating the alarm system. If access is needed during an "armed" period, please contact a staff member to make arrangements for unlocking.
