From Our Pastor...

MARCH WITH HOPE

March is upon us; it is the beginning of the season of spring and the start of daylight savings time. It is a time of shaking off the winter blues and anticipating warmer weather and the burst of blossoms. And in the church's observance, it is still the time of Lent. But like our expectations for the coming of spring, our Lenten anticipations are to be filled with hope, a hope built upon the foundation of God's promises manifested in the presence of the risen Jesus and to be experienced in the life of faith and shared participation in the body of Christ. Against the backdrop of a world darkened by the effects of sin, we sisters and brothers in Christ are called and encouraged to bear bold witness before both good and evil by presenting ourselves as agents and ambassadors of hope to proclaim in word and deed that God's promises in and through the risen Jesus will come to full fruition in spite of the apparent advances of evil, sinful intent.

If God is for us, who can prevail against us? Live in hope and walk by faith.

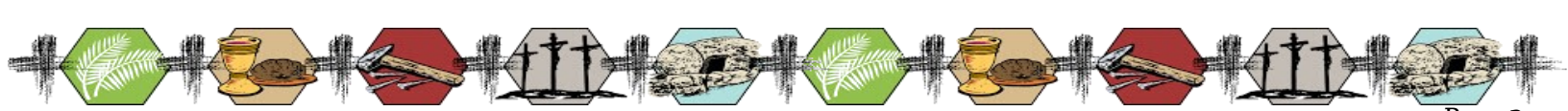

Camp Mount Luther

Our congregations have a valuable resource literally in our backyard: Camp Mount Luther. There you will find accommodating staff, valuable programs, and great facilities that will bring added life, creativity, and opportunities to you and this congregation.

This year's summer theme is "Generation to Generation." According to Camp Executive Director Chad Hershberger, you "will explore the stories Bible characters and their responses to God's call and promised faithfulness in their lives. [You] will see how the enduring love instilled in the promise to Abraham and Sarah continue through Old Testament characters, to Jesus, to the early church, and on to you." Camp is for those who just completed kindergarten up to grade 11. Various camps for these age groups run from June 14 to August 4.
