PASTOR'S PARAGRAPHS

Grace and peace to you!

Lent is a time of preparation and fasting that begins on Ash Wednesday (March 2nd this year), in which we are reminded that we are dust and to dust, we shall return.

Every year as Lent approaches, I think about what I will give up or what other people are going to give up. And, every year, I end up giving up baked goods like pies, cakes, and cookies. I give up baked goods because they are my biggest weakness. A few years ago, I decided to not only give up baked goods; I also decided that I would give up coffee too. Boy, was that a mistake! Now, before Lent started, I didn't ease into giving up coffee, like only drinking a cup or two a day; when Ash Wednesday rolled around, I went cold turkey. Cold turkey was not a good idea for someone who drinks as much coffee as I do! But I stuck with it! In the first week or two, I would say I was miserable. I had extreme headaches, I was jittery, and I was a grizzly bear; you didn't want to be around me. By the end of Lent, I felt cleansed; I felt like a brand-new person.

But then I wondered, was it the thing that I added. You see, for the last five or six years, I also take something up. I always add prayer. It seems odd that I would add prayer. I mean, I am a pastor; I lead two congregations in prayer, and I pray privately. But I want to go deeper in prayer and pray as I have never prayed before. I usually

start like I want, always being in constant prayer, but I never finish the way I want. Even though I don't hit that sense of prayer that I want to, I still feel spiritually renewed at the end of Lent. For me, that is what Lent is all about—being spiritually renewed and spiritually cleansed—becoming closer to God and becoming more faithful, being in a right and genuine relationship with the living God. Even though we may fail in our Lenten journey, God is always there to pick us up and cleanse us and renew us.

We give things up to make room to take things up. So, don't get caught up in the trend of just giving something up without attempting to take something up as well. Give up something that is getting in the way of your relationship with God.

This Lenten season remember that you are dust and rejoice because God is always with you!

LENT BEGINS MARCH 2, which means it's time to start thinking about making our Easter eggs again. This year we are planning to make eggs for seven (7) Mondays beginning the Monday preceding Lent. <u>Providing there is enough help</u>, eggs will be mixed and shaped starting at 9:00 am each Monday morning and coating and packaging will begin each Monday evening at 6:00 pm. This is a great fundraiser for the Church and much help will be needed both at 9:00 am and at 6:00 pm to make this project successful.

In order for this fundraiser to be successful, **EVERY week** 8 - 10 helpers are needed in the morning and 12 - 15 helpers are needed in the evening. Please let Bev know if you can help, and when, so that we know if we have enough help to make eggs each week. The more help we have, the quicker we will get done. If there are not enough volunteers signed up, Eggs **will not** be made that week.



Notes for January:

The Income and Net Income are very strong for January. The reason is \$8,360.84 is income from the John Snook benefit dinner held January 29th. The funds from that event were not given to John until February. Even with the Snook income removed from the monthly income, we have \$13,075.62 from offerings and other sources as shown in the Sources of Income for Jan. 2022 below and net income was positive.

NOTE FROM CLIFF: I have records back to 2017 when I started as Financial Recording Secretary. This is the first January in my records that January had a positive net income.

The only expense items worth mentioning are Electric was \$867 and Heating Oil was \$1,708 (received 712 gallons) in January. Our 2022 projected utilities expenses are projected to be higher than past years.
