PASTOR'S PARAGRAPHS

Grace and peace to you!

"My God, my God, why have you forsaken me? Why are you so far from helping me, from the words of my groaning? ² O my God, I cry by day, but you do not answer; and by night, but find no rest.....²⁹ To him, indeed, shall all who sleep in the earth bow down; before him shall bow all who go down to the dust, and I shall live for him. ³⁰ Posterity will serve him; future generations will be told about the Lord, ³¹ and proclaim his deliverance to a people yet unborn, saying that he has done it."—Psalm 22:1-2, 29-31

This is a glimpse of the Psalm that will be used on Good Friday. It is interesting how it begins and how it ends. The psalmist begins by asking God why have you abandoned me, but in the end, proclaims the earth will bow down and that they will live for him. I am sure during these two years of the pandemic, and now with the war in Ukraine, we probably have felt very similar, thinking God has truly abandoned us and that God is not helping us. All you have to do is look around, and you will see God working through all of this. God is working in and through the doctors and nurses helping those who are sick. It is God working through the scientists looking for a cure. It is God who is working through our world leaders, trying to bring peace to this broken world. God never abandons us; God is always working to help us!

When I teach confirmation classes, I ask the kids to share a high point of their week and one low point of their week, and where they have seen God at work in the world. I am amazed at where they see God working. Sometimes, we see God working in those little things that we take for granted, like the birth of a calf on the farm. Take some time

this week and sit on the front porch or look out a window and I bet you will see God working in the world!

I continue to lift you all up in prayer, and if there is anything that you need, please let me know.

CULC WILL CONTINUE TO MAKE EASTER EGGS on April 4 and April 11 provided we have enough help. Eggs will be mixed and shaped starting at 9:00 a.m. each Monday morning and coating and packaging will begin each Monday evening at 6:00 p.m.

In order for this fundraiser to be successful, **EVERY week** 8-10 helpers are needed in the morning and 12-15 helpers are needed in the evening. Please let Bev Catherman know if you can help, and when, so that we know if we have enough help to make the eggs. The more help we have, the quicker we will get done. If there are not enough volunteers signed up, Eggs **will not** be made that week.

Everything will be done with the current CDC guidelines being enforced; masks, social distancing, sanitation, etc.

The Easter Egg candy will be sold at \$1.50 each and \$7.50/tray of 6. Trays will come in peanut butter, coconut, and mixed. Pretzels will be \$3/bag.

#### **ZOOM CHEAT SHEET FOR BEGINNERS**

If you've never or rarely use ZOOM, here are a few easy steps to get you started.

#### What is ZOOM?

Zoom is an on-line, internet-based, videoconferencing software.

# What do I need to join a Zoom meeting?

- a. Laptop, tablet or smartphone, preferably with a web camera
- b. Internet connection (WiFi or wired)
- c. An email invitation from the meeting organizer

If you're accessing Zoom from an iPad/Tablet or cell phone, you'll first need to download the

ZOOM App onto your device from the App Store.

You DO NOT need to create an account to join a ZOOM meeting.

#### If you were given a hyperlink in your email invite:

1. Click on the hyperlink in the email, your web browser will open, and take you directly into

the Zoom meeting. [Hyperlinks are underlined and begin with the letters 'https']

- 2. You may need to click on [open.zoom.us], especially the first time you use Zoom
- 3. Click "Join with Computer Audio"

### If you don't have a hyperlink in your email invite:

1. Open up your web browser (Explorer, Edge, Chrome, Firefox) and type in "Zoom.com." [You

can then make this a 'Favorite,' or add it to your Desktop, if you like.]

- 2. Click on [Join a Meeting] in the menu
- 3. Type in the Meeting ID number from the email, then click JOIN
- 4. Follow steps 2 & 3 in the above section

#### Tips once in a ZOOM meeting:

- A. If you see: "Waiting for Host to Start this Meeting," just wait for them to join.
- B. If a password is asked for, it will be in the email from the meeting organizer.
- C. Adjust your camera to center your face on the screen so people can see you properly.
- D. Your microphone and camera ON/OFF icons are in the bottom left corner of the screen.
- E. Click on Participants at the bottom center of the screen to see others in the meeting.
- F. Please keep yourself on Mute unless speaking. Be respectful when others are talking.
- G. The CHAT button at the bottom of the screen allows you type a message to participants

To leave the meeting at any time, simply close the Window



Mount Luther is gearing up for the 2022 summer camping season. Registrations are now being accepted for all programs until they are filled. Campers who register before April 15th will receive a discount on their camp fee.

This year's camping season will begin on June 19, 2022. Resident and Day Camps run until August 5. There are programs for all ages from kindergarten to senior high, adults, and families. Most sessions run for one week, but there are also half-week and day-only sessions.

New programs this year include Family Pick-A-Day, which allows you to come for a day of adventure during our Family Camp. We'll plan a special activity on July 6 and 7 and announce it online. Also new this year is Elective Explosion which allows you to pick what you want to do during a special session each day (July 10-15). We'll have electives themed around water, crafts, sports, Legos, nature, sewing, singing, folk music, and drama. And our new Wild Pioneers, Juniors, and Intermediates will feature more nature activities as well as learning about our environment. This year's theme at Mount Luther is "Boundless: God beyond Measure." Campers will enter the hopeful and saving story of God and God's people and experience the God's boundless creating, loving, and merciful power for us. Through the camp's method of studying the Bible, called "GROW Time," staff will help campers Gather and Reflect On the Word throughout their day, culminating in an evening worship service.
