Community is defined in a couple of ways:

- 1) "a group of people living together in the same place or having a particular characteristic in common."
- 2) "a feeling of fellowship with others, as a result of sharing common attitudes, interests, and goals, 'the sense of community that organized religion can provide.'"

Over the past couple of years, I've seen a community grow not only in its faith but also in its love for the people in the church and the people in the community in which they live. Tragedy after tragedy, this community rallies together. I have witnessed hundreds of people gather on a Sunday afternoon to pray for a child. Gift cards have been collected, and hundreds of meals have been made for needy families. The Buffalo Valley Lutheran Parish has held community meals and raised over \$50,000 for families in need! On the first Saturday of each month, community members gather at First Lutheran for a free meal and fellowship. On Wednesday mornings, volunteers at 4 Bells give food to approximately 130 families!

I have started volunteering at Camp Koala, working with grieving youth in our community. Also, if you like breakfast and fellowship, we have started a breakfast club on Tuesday mornings at 9 am at Boomerang's.

You all are playing a part in doing God's work in our community! You all are an example of what community is about, and I am so blessed to be a part of it! I give thanks to God for all the work that you do! I give thanks to those of you who have asked if my family was affected by the tornados in Nebraska last week. I also thank those of you who have checked in on me and sent prayers.

The cost of altar flowers is now \$50 for 2 vases, instead of \$40.


#### **Empty Coffee Cans Needed**

#### PENTECOST MAY 19



The two most common Pentecost symbols represent the Holy Spirit. A descending dove is frequently used to symbolize the coming of the Spirit, since the Gospel of Luke reports that the Holy Spirit came to Jesus at his baptism in the form of a dove. (Luke 3:22). Tongues of fire are also used to symbolize the Holy Spirit, based on the account of Pentecost found in Acts 2:1-4. The liturgical color for the Day of Pentecost is bright red, which reminds us of the fire of the Spirit.

Bright red is also the color of the geraniums we use to decorate the sanctuary on Pentecost. If you would like to donate some geraniums for this purpose (the plants will then be planted around the church), please fill out the form below and return it to Janice Wagner or Margie.

#### Summer Camp Season at Camp Mount Luther

This year's camping season will begin on June 23, 2024. Resident and Day Camps run until August 2. There are programs for all ages from kindergarten to senior high, adults, and families. Most sessions run for one week, but there are also half-week and dayonly sessions, including a Create-A-Camp option. The Mount Luther experience is a blend of small and large group activities. Campers spend most of their time in a cabin group with peer campers and their counselors. A Family Camp will be held during the week of June 30 and there is also a Servant and Leadership Training (SALT) camp for senior high. Theme weeks for Night Owl, Water Adventure, and Christmas in July are also being offered.

This year's theme at Mount Luther is "Created to be." We will explore how God gives us freedom to be our authentic selves and what it means to be siblings in Christ humans who are brave enough to encourage and stand up for each other, sharing burdens as well as joys. We grow and learn more about ourselves while listening to and sharing with each other. Through the camp's method of studying the Bible, called "GROW Time," staff will help campers gather and reflect on the Word throughout their day, culminating in an evening worship service. Campers also get to do crafts, go swimming, play games, camp out, and sing songs during their time at Mount Luther.

**In-Kind Offering**: We will be accepting non-perishable food items for Agape Ministries in Bloomsburg.




#### SYNOD NEWS
