It's hard to believe that it's November already and the holiday season is upon us! It will soon be time to celebrate Thanksgiving and reflect on all the things we are thankful for. I am looking forward to spending a week with my family in Nebraska and officiating my niece's wedding.

I have spent some time recently reflecting on the song "Gratitude" by Brandon Lake. First, the word "gratitude" is defined as the feeling of appreciation for kindness or what is valuable. I first heard the song "Gratitude" after a traumatic event in this community, and Emily Seebold sang it at First the following Sunday. The words really hit me that morning, and it almost brought me to tears. The first two verses and the chorus go like this: "All my words fall short, I got nothing new. How could I express all my gratitude? I could sing these songs as I often do, but every song must end, and you never do. So I throw up my hands and praise you again and again cause all that I have is a hallelujah, hallelujah. And I know it's not much but I've nothing else fit for a King except for a heart singing hallelujah, hallelujah." We are all in different seasons of our lives. And, in those seasons we face many different things both good and bad. Sometimes we might feel that God is not with us, so it makes it hard to show "gratitude". ## **Parish Collecting Winter Accessories**


The Parish will once again be collecting Hats, Scarves, Mittens and Gloves, starting in December. Watch for more details in bulletins and the December newsletter.

"Still other seed fell on good soil. It came up, grew and produced a crop, some multiplying 30, some 60, some 100 times." Mark 4:8

According to Mark 4:1-8, there are 4 types of people who hear God's Word. God's Word is like seed and people's hearts are like soil.

Mark 4:3-4 says that the 1st type of person hears God's Word, but birds (symbolizing the devil) immediately steal it. The 2nd type of person, described in Mark 4:5-6 receives God's Word and is excited about it. The Amplified Bible says that they accept it, but "only superficially" (Mark 4:16). The 3rd type of person allows cares, concerns, and the things of the world to distract them from the truth of God's Word. (Mark 4:7, 18-19).

The 4th type of person is what I hope you and I will always be. Let us be mature Christians who hear the Word, receive it, obey it, guard it, and allow it to work in us so that our lives bear good fruit for God, meaning that we do something that honors Him and benefits others with the time, talents, and resources He has given us.

Make sure you are good soil for God's Word by guarding your heart against the enemy, persevering, and holding tight to its truth when troubles come your way. Refuse to allow worry or worldly things to distract you from the Word.


A prayer: Father help me to be good soil – to have a heart in which your Word will take root, grow, and multiply. In Jesus' Name. Amen.


## **Hope for Homes**
