It was because they believed God was fulfilling God's promise of a New Exodus through the person and work of Jesus that they lived this new journey life-style

Two thousand years later that New Exodus is still going-people are being brought out of the Exile of sin and death into the new in covenant with God. We are still walking the "The Way" with Jesus. Youth will be invited to consider the way of Jesus, the challenges we encounter along the way, the cost of 'discipleship' or of following the way, and the joy we encounter on the way, particularly in the community of the beloved. Storytelling will include relating our historical journeys to modern-day stories of people who are currently striving to follow the way of Christ.
