PASTOR'S PARAGRAPHS

Grace and peace to you!

The season of Lent has begun, and we are part way through our journey to repent and return. If you have attended our Wednesday night services, you have been a part of my sermon series "Return to the Lord." On Ash Wednesday, we heard from the book of Joel: "Return to the Lord your God, for He is gracious and merciful, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love; and He relents over disaster." Each one of the sermons in this series will focus on a particular event in the Passion and will have a focus on the people who were involved in that event.

On Ash Wednesday, we heard "A Call to Return." We have also heard "Return to Prayer" and "Return from Betrayal." As we continue on our Lenten journey, we will travel to Holy Week listening to "Return from False Witness," "Return from Denial," and "Return to the Kingdom of God." On Maundy Thursday, we will "Return to the Table," and on Good Friday, we will "Return to Truth." On Easter morning, we will "Return and See." I invite you to join us as we make our way to the cross and the empty tomb as we "Return to the Lord." We have a time of food and fellowship before our Wednesday services at 6 pm, and our service begins at 7 pm. On Maundy Thursday, we will have a meal at 6 pm and a service at 7 pm with a stripping of the altar.

May your Lenten journey remind you of your baptism and the sacrifices Jesus made for us.

May we rejoice on Easter Sunday that our Lord's call to return was issued so that we might have abundant life through Jesus Christ, the one who lived among us, the one who died on the cross for our sins, and rose again to give us eternal life.

LENT & EASTER ACTIVITIES

Lenten Sermon Series

For our Midweek, Holy Week, and Easter Services I will be doing a sermon series called "Return to the Lord."

In the Book of Joel, the prophet paints a vivid picture of the coming judgment of God, the Day of the Lord. The imagery is bold and terrifying: hordes of locusts swarming over the land and decimating everything. Joel's prophecy has teeth even today as wars rage, natural disasters threaten and destroy, and our culture seems to be unraveling. But right in the middle of this frightening portent, we find a tender invitation from the Lord: "Return to the Lord your God, for He is gracious and merciful, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love; and He relents over disaster" (Joel 2:13). God's invitation and promise finds its fullness in Jesus Christ, who personifies and accomplishes all that God declares. During this season of Lent, we will consider the theme "Return to the Lord" and examine how the call to return played out in practical ways for the people who walked alongside Christ as He demonstrated and carried out God's grace and mercy on our behalf, taking God's wrath upon Himself, setting the stage for God to "turn and relent, and leave a blessing behind Him" (Joel 2:14).

Each sermon in this series focuses on a particular event in the Passion, with a special focus on the people involved in the event. Studying the events and people helps to connect the hearers with their own sinful nature, to emphasize how we have turned away from the Lord, and to reinforce and rejoice in God's call for us to return to Him with all our heart. ~ Pastor Curt

Breaking Bread (formerly known as the Progressive Dinner)

Breaking Bread is a time to get together with others in the Parish to have a meal/food and get to know others with whom you don't usually socialize. If an individual doesn't have transportation – offer to pick them up! Mix up ages and backgrounds – so interesting! Play cards or games, put a puzzle together while chatting...expect that when you say good-bye that it will not be the last time you see or talk to each other.
