Grace and peace to you!

Following Jesus takes sacrifice, dedication, and focus. Somewhere along our journey the idea got put in our head that following Jesus will bring nothing but positives in our lives. We need to remember this life of faith we are in will take work, effort, and determination. This journey will not be easy and will probably be one of the hardest things we will have to do.

Jesus sacrificed much, not just on the cross but before the cross. Jesus was out in the streets getting dirty; he was in the countryside with the sick, the poor, the hungry, and the outcasts. He was with the people that many of us would not associate with. Sacrifice is part of our calling!

What have you had to sacrifice to follow Jesus? What has gotten in the way of your dedication to Christ?

Applications for the Wehr & Munson Memorial Scholarships are available in the office to students who have completed three semesters of college courses. The deadline for submission is August 1st.

FELC BUY THE BOOKS SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

For the purpose of promoting higher education, the Lutheran Church Women (LCW) of First Lutheran have established a Buy the Books Scholarship Program to help offset the cost of FALL semester books for qualifying students. The scholarship is for a maximum \$500 reimbursement per year, per student for FALL semester books. The scholarship is for college, university or trade school students who are active, confirmed members of First Lutheran & who meet the scholarship requirements. Students must apply, be accepted & submit book receipts for reimbursement to take place. Students may sell back any unwanted books at the end of the FALL semester and use monies to help offset the cost of books for their SPRING and SUMMER semesters. September 3 - Dandelion Run

Camp Mount Luther will be holding a 5-and 10-kilometer trail run race at the camp on Saturday, September 3, 2022. This is an entry-level trail race on Mount Luther grounds with proceeds going to the camp. The start time for the race is 9:00 a.m. Runners decide on race day if they want to do a 5k or 10K (a double loop of the 5K) run. You must be registered by August 8 by 6:00 p.m. to receive a hoodie. Registration is \$35. Registration opens at 7:30 a.m. on race day. Shower facilities are available after the race. All miles for the course will be marked and there is one water stop on the course. The Dandelion Run, begun in 2002, is organized by Joel and Shelley Heasley of Middleburg. It was named in honor and memory of Rev. Glenn E. Heasley, Jr., former Assistant to the Bishop of the Upper Susquehanna Synod of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America. Glenn's favorite "flower" was the dandelion. Heasley's widow, Shirley, is also involved in the planning of the race.

SYNOD NEWS



Join us as we celebrate the last six years of ministry of Rev. Barbara J. Collins as our bishop. At her request, a pizza party will be held at Camp Mount Luther on **Saturday**, **August 27**, **2022**, starting at noon. Cost will be \$20 per person. Tickets will be available for purchase at Synod Assembly and will be available online soon. In addition, the synod is providing Bishop Collins with two gifts, one for her and her husband and a monetary gift to Camp Mount Luther (again, at her request). Introducing the New Bishop

The Rev. Craig A. Miller, of Mifflinburg, was elected to serve a six-year term as bishop during the Annual Assembly of the Upper Susquehanna Synod. Pastor Miller is currently serving as Assistant to the Bishop & Director of Evangelical Mission.

Rev. Miller began his work in October 2016 as assistant to Bishop Barbara J. Collins and Director of Evangelical Mission. Pastor Miller came to our synod from Brooklyn, New York, where he served at Our Saviour's Lutheran Church for 20 years. He graduated with an MDiv from the Lutheran Theological Seminary at Philadelphia in 1996 and was ordained in the same year on June 14. He holds a BS in Forestry from the State University of New York College of Environmental Science and Forestry. While not a native of this area, Pastor Miller has family ties here: his mother grew up in Northumberland and he has aunts and cousins in Selinsgrove, Northumberland, and Danville. His father, also a pastor, was born and raised in Kutztown but moved the family to Brooklyn when Craig was 6 years old. Pastor Miller's wife, Nancy, received her Master's in Social Work and works as a counselor and therapist. Their daughter, CarolAnn, is a vocal performance major at Muhlenberg College.

Pastor Miller, a member of Messiah Evangelical Lutheran Church, New Berlin, will be installed on September 17 at Zion Lutheran Church in Sunbury.
