From Our Pastor...

BEGINNING WITH THANKSGIVING

In many of the Apostle Paul's letters to the various churches, he begins his correspondence with note of thanksgiving for the people and ministries of churches. these Each thank you normally bears witness to the grace and empowerment received in and through Christ, the constancy of prayer for and recognition of the ministry performed by the church in Christ's name, and hope for continued faithfulness encouragement for what ahead. In Thessalonians, Paul "WE **ALWAYS** writes. GIVE THANKS TO GOD for all of you and mention you in our prayers, remembering constantly before our God and Father your work of faith and labor love of and steadfastness of hope in our Lord Jesus Christ." In Philippians, Paul begins his address by writing, "I THANK MY GOD EVERY TIME I remember you, constantly praying with joy in every one of my prayers for all of you, because of your sharing in the gospel from the first day until now."

Thanksgivings, as understood by the Apostle Paul, serve both as a form of remembrance as well as a way of entrance into a

beginning. new These thanksqivings recall what already occurred has under and through the gracious workings of God in Christ and look forward with encouragement and hope for a future of ministry and service empowered by living presence of Christ. In 1 Corinthians, Paul states, "I GIVE THANKS TO MY GOD ALWAYS for you because of the grace of God that has been given you in Christ Jesus, for in every way you have been enriched in him, in speech and knowledge of every kind." Here, Paul acknowledges that provides thanksqiving awareness opportunity of what God's grace has already done as well what God continues to do in Christ for the future of the church. As we remember from our past, so too does our future depend upon and is called to rely on the strengthening presence of God's faithfulness grace as Paul notes, "He will also strengthen you to the end, so that you may be blameless on the day of our Lord Jesus Christ. God is faithful; by him you called into the were fellowship of his Son, Jesus Christ our Lord."

In Colossians, Paul confirms the powerful relationship of the church's thanksgiving with the gracious work of God in Christ. Paul writes, "In our prayers for you WE ALWAYS THANK GOD the Father of our Lord Iesus Christ, for we have heard of your faith in Christ Jesus and of the love that you have for all the saints, because of the hope laid up for you in Paul heaven." adds regarding the productive power of this faith and hope in God's grace: "Just as it is bearing fruit and growing in the whole world, so it has been bearing fruit among yourselves from the day you heard it and truly comprehended the grace of God."

As your pastor, I want to take this opportunity to thank God for all of you and for everyone involved the life of Christ's United Lutheran Church First Evangelical Lutheran Church. Bv God's grace, our congregations have had and glorious ministries. And as come to the close of one calendar year and about to enter into a new year, a new beginning, we will continue be TRANSFORMED BY THE LIVING PRESENCE OF CHRIST JESUS AS WE SHARE THE GOSPEL and bear witness to what is possible because of God's grace. BANQUET HELP WANTED

We will soon be serving banquets once again. What you may not be aware of is 'Help is always needed'.

Help is needed in the dining room to serve the meals. We serve family style, so it is a matter of getting the dishes of food to each table. Once they have eaten, cake is served. Someone is needed to serve coffee at larger banquets as well. At smaller banquets, each server will cover their own tables. Servers are usually asked to arrive 45 minutes before serving time.

Help is needed in the kitchen as well. Some people are needed to come early, sometimes as early as 7:00 a.m. or 8:00 a.m. to start cooking the meat. Others are needed to come about 3 hours before serving time to cut meat. Several are needed about 2 hours before serving time to dish up the pickles, olives and applesauce. About an hour before serving time, others are needed to dish up the foods that will be taken to the tables.

All are encouraged to stay for dishwashing and clean-up!
