

#### THE HOLY SPIRIT AND THE COMMUNITY OF FAITH

We are the church. We believe that Jesus is our Lord and Savior. We trust in the righteousness and justice of God's ways. We hope in the assurance of God's promises. In spite of our shortcomings and failings, we live and strive by the means of God's grace and mercy. In the midst of suffering and tragedy, fear and terror, we cling to the faithfulness of Jesus and His abiding presence. And we are called to lean on each other as Jesus draws us together as one body. As such, we are the church with purpose, equipped and empowered by the Holy Spirit to bear witness to God's truth and to serve one another according to the will of God.

Through Jesus, God has given us the gift of faith. This gift pertains to trust, obedience and commitment, that we will live our lives according to God's ways revealed in and through Jesus. And we are able to live such lives because God has given us the direction and the ability to actualize God's will for us through the gift of the Holy Spirit. The gospel of Jesus lives through us by the working of the Spirit in order that we become able to share this same gospel in

word and deed with the world around us so that all may come to know God and live by this gift of faith.

St. Paul writes: "For in the one Spirit we were all baptized into one body-Jews or Greeks, slaves or free-and we were all made to drink of one Spirit." (1 Corinthians 12:13)

From the perspective of St. Paul, the Holy Spirit renders us capable to carry out the purposes and promises of God by drawing us together as one body in Christ and by giving us the gifts necessary to accomplish the fulfillment of the gospel of Jesus for all. The Spirit acquaints us actively to God's will for us revealed in and through Jesus and strengthens us to follow the ways of Jesus with common purpose and hope. In 1 Corinthians 12:7, St. Paul asserts: "To each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good." Each and every one of us has received gifts from the Holy Spirit to draw us together and for the gifts to be utilized in communion to carry out the purposes and promises of God. As such, St. Paul would have us realize that to know and understand God's plan and purpose for us is to put into action the gifts we

have each been given by the Holy Spirit.

St. Paul asserts that as much as we understand our need for God and God's direction for us through Jesus, we also are to realize how much we need each other because it is in and through us that the Holy Spirit works and has given us the gifts to be utilized in communion for the actualization of God's plans and promises. These gifts of and from the Spirit are the means by which God creates and sustains community as well as bearing witness to God's ultimate plans for us and our future.

We have a bright and promising future as the church because each of us have received gifts from the Spirit which empowers us to serve God by serving one another through proclamation, teaching, caring, helping, etc. We as the community of faith will continue to bear witness to God's promises for us but only insofar as we exercise together the gifts that have been given to us (that's each and every one of us) by the Spirit.

Every day there seems to be another news report about violence, turmoil and upheaval in our world. Groups in our country and around the world are working against each other. How do we resolve these issues? We come together and work towards a common goal of a life following God and the teachings of Jesus.

Sunday, December 4th


