From Our Pastor...

CROSS-BEARING DISCIPLESHIP

This month, the church celebrates the 500th anniversary of the Reformation, initiated as Martin Luther tacked 95 theses on a church door in Wittenberg, Germany for the purpose of engaging theological debate, primarily redirecting the church to engage its ministry and mission by following not the precepts of human want and desire but the way revealed in the crucified and risen Jesus. For Luther, the church, if it is to be faithful to the gospel of Jesus Christ, is to bear witness to the manner in which Jesus lived in faithful obedience to the will of God, even to the point of dying on the cross (Philippians 2), and to bear the marks of Christ on the cross in ministry and mission before and to the world. Cross-bearing discipleship is about having the same mind as was in Christ Jesus (Philippians 2), and acting faithfully in the ways of conviction, commitment, and courage.

Douglas John Hall in The Cross in Our Context suggests, "Faith in the crucified one means courage to love the world and to seek one's place in it despite both the world's indifference and one's own yearning for security and calm." He adds, "The risen Christ, in his eternal reign as in his historical sojourn, is always going toward this world, the world's rejection notwithstanding, and discipleship, when it is authentically so, is always a matter of being taken up into this world-directedness, despite one's own preference for security and peace."

God's claim upon our world and our destiny is most surely to be understood through the cross (and resurrection) of Jesus. As Hall states, "the cross of Jesus is the endconsequence of the divine determination to be 'with us' (Emmanuel)..." The cross marks the unconditional and irrevocable participation of God in the life of the world.

Christian discipleship is a call to engage the world via the cross of Jesus; it moves beyond merely reflecting the world's standards. Through the priority of nonjudgmental and unconditional love, Christian discipleship demands justice, equality, inclusivity, and fair opportunity. As such, discipleship demands continual awareness of present day realities, a contextual awareness. Again Hall clarifies, "Engagement of the world occurs only where the bread of the gospel is cast on the waters of time and placenot carelessly, as pearls before swine, not just given away without any concern for its reception. Nevertheless, the evangelist is called to risk a real sharing of this precious thing, and that means to risk having it taken up into the souls and minds of others..."

The gospel of Jesus, bearing full witness to the meaning of the cross for the church and its witness, must always be discovered and rediscovered in relation to the specifics of the here and now. Our articulation of the good news need be formulated only as we experience and attempt to comprehend the bad news that is oppressive to many in God's beloved creation.

In short, discipleship demands a choice: "the love of power" or "the power of love." The cross reveals Jesus' choice.



Absent: Jim Schwartz, Logan Mensch, Jane Moore, Liz Loss

Pr. John opened with devotions, reviewing a few of Jesus' sayings from the Gospel of Matthew.

Doug & Morgan Richard: Expressed gratitude for allowing them to use space at the church and gave an update of their general practice and intent of their couples/relational therapy.

Secretary's Report: submitted and approved as read

Treasurer's Report: submitted and needs correction and will be resubmitted at September meeting subject to audit

Pastor's report: Pr. John reported on various members health status and visits.

Communication: Received a note from Rocky Boy Reservation thanking us for the \$1000 donation for a copier.

Worship & Music - Bill Musser - no report

Property – Ed Libhart reported on Jim Schwartz's behalf. New sign on Chestnut St. has been installed. Weeds around property were sprayed by Jeff Mensch & Jim Schwartz. Painting contract has been signed. Ed has met with Tony Sweigert to discuss replacing coal furnace. Security system has changed our phone reception to a Verizon dialer. There are spots on walls in sanctuary that need paint touch ups. Shrubs on Chestnut need trimmed. New thermostat in sanctuary for A/C has been installed. The A/C in sanctuary is not usable. There is a leak in the coil in the air handler. Will need replaced; coil is \$8400 for just the coil and does not include refrigerant, installation and freight. Need to get price quotes on all new units. Also discussed old freezer in the basement that houses old records that are getting mildewed. Pr. John, Jeff Mensch and Gloria Mincemoyer are going to review the records and determine how to proceed. Received an estimate from Tony Sweigert to replace coal furnace and that will be tabled for now.

Christian Education – Harry Boyer reported that Sunday School will start soon and Christian Ed. will meet this month.

Fellowship & Recreation – no report

Service & Outreach – Deanna Billow reported that postcards went out to all members for the upcoming pictures. Birthday cards went out for August.

Finance – need to schedule 2nd quarter meeting and start planning 2018 budget.

Youth – Gary Girton reported that the Montana and Harvey Cedars trips went well. A slide show was shown to everyone last Sunday. Discussion was had to show it again some Sunday before church as well for those who were unable to see it – possibly September 10th.

Staff Support – Barb Randecker reported that they met with Tom Taylor last week. Discussion was had with lawn mowing and snow removal being outsourced. Further discussion on the performance of the Facilities manager position. Motion made and seconded to issue a 30 day notice to terminate Tom. Further discussion before vote included splitting the position back to two separate entities. Motion passed unanimously.

Purchase Requisitions: Much discussion was had regarding completing purchase req's correctly and completely ensuring that items are being requested before time of purchase and limits to spending. Council requested we enclose detailed youth report with monthly reports. Using personal credit cards and then requesting reimbursement should only occur as a last result; the church credit card should be used as a priority. Harry Boyer requested Heather Klose go to the bank tomorrow and obtain a new signature card for General Fund checking account to remove Andy Long and Jeff Crossland as signors and add Harry Boyer and Barb Randecker.

Bulletins: Harry **Boyer** has had requests for more large print bulletins. The cost to do all large bulletins is approximately \$3.38. Motion made and seconded to change to all large print bulletins. Motion passed unanimously.

Fobs: Heather Klose requested approval to order additional fobs due to greater need and lost items. Motion made and seconded to purchase 20 fobs; passed unanimously.

Chief Ushers switch: Gary Girton will do September and Tanna Stenger will do December, less Christmas Eve @ 5PM.

Meeting closed with prayer by Harry Boyer and adjourned @ 2138.
