PASTOR'S PARAGRAPHS

Grace and peace to you!

"After this the Lord appointed seventy-two others and sent them on ahead of him in pairs to every town and place where he himself intended to go. ² He said to them, "The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few; therefore ask the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into his harvest. ³ Go on your way; I am sending you out like lambs into the midst of wolves."—Luke 10:1-3

This is part of the gospel text for this Sunday, July 6th. Most of our days revolve around numbers. There are 168 hours in a week. Of those 168 hours, 40-50 hours are spent at a full-time job. As a pastor, much of my time is spent on numbers and strategies for increasing them. How do we increase our attendance? How do we increase our giving? How many meetings do I have to attend this week? How do we stay on budget? You see what I mean! This gospel text is about numbers. Jesus sends out 72 disciples. Not 700 or 7,000 but 72. And think about what they accomplished. Not just in this story, but think about the day, months, and years ahead of them. This is probably the core group who will go out and preach and teach the gospel after Pentecost. In later years, their descendants will go on and do great and amazing things for the church. Just 72 people at the beginning, and they had the faith and courage to change the world. And think, they did this without a purse, no bag, and no sandals. There were no guarantees on how they would be received in communities, but what they had was the promise that Jesus would go with them and do great things through them!

This story is also about community. According to the 2023 Faith Communities Today national survey, the average church in the U.S. has a median of 60 regular worship participants. So, why are you here? One of the main reasons we come to church is to know that this is our group of 72! We are not in this alone; we are here for each other. God has an interesting habit of accomplishing incredible things with the most unlikely people. Some of the gifts that Jesus gives his disciples are teamwork and trusting obedience. Because when we work together, when we recall that God said it is not good for us to be alone, when we see our hope and welfare are linked to those around us, then we not only can accomplish so much more than we possibly could alone, but we discover that our names, along with those first disciples, are written in the book of heaven.

What might it mean if our parish were to remember Jesus' counsel and command and work and dream together of a more vibrant witness to the Christian faith? There are things we cannot accomplish alone, but we can do together. I invite you to practice relying on one another for HELP, ENCOURAGEMENT, and SUPPORT, and to turn to God in prayer for assistance with these things.

As always, I continue to lift you up in prayer! If you have any pastoral care needs, please don't hesitate to let me know.

### Recent Upper Susquehanna Synod Statistics

### Congregations: 112

13 served by Synodically Authorized Minister

3 served by TEEM (Theological Education for Emerging Ministries) candidate 37 with interim pastor

10 with no appointed/called leader

63 of 112 congregations (>56%) have no called pastor

### Leaders: 93 pastors, 5 deacons, 37 authorized lay worship leaders

55 (59%) of pastors are retired
6 pastors are in special calls
1 pastor is disabled
2 pastors are on leave
Average age of pastors serving in a call or an interim is 60 years
16 pastors aged above 65 years are serving 35 congregations.

### **Action Alert**

No one in a state of agricultural abundance should go hungry! **With pending** federal cuts to hunger programs such as the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), a stalled negotiation on an updated Farm Bill, and continued inflation of food and housing costs, more and more Pennsylvanians are experiencing food insecurity.

Pennsylvania cannot make up the entire gap of funding left by congressional budget cuts, but we can make a significant investment in proven programs that help those in need and our Pennsylvania farmers and food system.

Most of our congregations help feed many thousands of Pennsylvanians through the direct service or support of hunger ministries. Many of our pantries rely on food made possible through two of the state's major anti-hunger programs, which are not keeping up with need. Some ministries report numbers three times pre-pandemic levels.

It is unacceptable that neighbors are going hungry in a state of such agricultural abundance. It is time to end shortfalls and adequately fund the State Food Purchase Program at a level of at least \$24.88 million in the State's 2025-2026 fiscal year budget. This needs to be IN ADDITION TO at least \$9 million for the Pa. Agricultural Surplus System, which allows PA farmers to direct high-quality surplus product that would otherwise go to waste, into the charitable food system.

Please alert your lawmakers to the need our ministries are witnessing first-hand and urge them to act. The church sees the needs of our neighbors

Some of the possible projects

- Let's Build Beds. This is a wonderful organization that builds beds for children ages 3-17. The goal is to provide safe sleeping space. This project involves building the beds and delivering them (if you choose) to the children. There is also an opportunity to get your congregation involved by collecting bedding and bringing it along.
- 2. Clean Your Streams. Toledo is on Lake Erie, and we have been affected by lack of clean water in our area over the years. This project usually involves trash pick-up or cleaning/painting storm drains.
- 3. Inner city community gardens
- 4. Building picnic tables
- 5. Working at the food bank packing boxes for senior citizens

A hunger workshop at the beginning to help Groups get in the mindset of serving people in poverty. One thing they will be doing this summer specifically is trying to get groups to interact with more people in the community.

Additionally, the area has a wonderful Park system. We can do things like hike, kayak/canoe, swim, par9cipate in a class at the park (archery, fishing, Paddleboarding, Etc.) The zoo is world award-winning and has a high-ropes course (great for team building)! It is close to Cedar Point, so the plan is to go there on Friday.

We will be staying at a church and making most of our meals there. We will have a few dinners out. Youth who want to go will need to pay a deposit of \$100.00 by Easter.
