From Our Pastor...

WHO DO PEOPLE SAY THAT WE ARE?

Deep into his ministry, Jesus asked his disciples, "Who do people say that I am?" Their response was varied, some indicating that he was a revisiting of some particular prophet from the past. Then he pressed them further by asking, "Who do you say that I am?" here, Peter speaks up by indicating that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of the living God.

As the church, we too recognize that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of the living God. This proclamation gives us our purpose as Christians, baptized and marked with the cross of Christ, and fed and sustained by his body and blood.

But we may also ask, "Who do people say that we are?"

Our collective identity as the church, the body of Christ, is

defined mostly from within. That is, we understand ourselves as sisters and brothers in Christ from a "believing" perspective. We identify ourselves as the church from perspectives gained from shared beliefs and practices within the collective history of the church and her traditions and rituals. But the question I posed is to ask how we are viewed and understood from the outside, from the perspective of the wider community and world that is not self-defined by the church's history of beliefs and practices. That is, does the wider community see us as we see ourselves?

Are they able to see the presence of Christ through us? Do they witness any Christ-like characteristics in our actions? Are they interested in what we have to offer through and be-

cause of our faith? Or are they unable to recognize any distinctive Christian quality in us, that is, do we just seem to blend in to the ways of the world? Or even, has the world around us grown tired and disinterested in our Christian witness or lack thereof?

Quite possibly we should understand that what happens within the church is but a dress rehearsal for what is to happen outside the church. What we say and do in our worship and ministry life within the church need be visible to the whole world around us. Who do people say that we are? All depends on how clearly and frequently they can see Christ in us.

Bible Study With Pastor John

The Cross: The Real and The Symbolic

We will be taking an in depth look at Christianity's primary symbol, the cross. We will begin by studying the gospel accounts of Jesus' crucifixion, as well as exploring the historical roots of Rome's use of the cross as an instrument of torture, humiliation and death. We will then look at Jesus' call to his followers to take up their own cross in order to follow him. Additionally, we will explore Paul's metaphorical usage of the cross to describe Christian faith and discipleship. Finally, we will address the manner in which an instrument of death turned symbolically into a representation of the Christian faith. This will include an exploration of the many types of crosses that have been used by the Christian church throughout its history.
